## *From the Desk of the Reverend Joanna D. Graham*

....Magi from the East arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews?"

We saw his star at its rising  
and have come to do him homage." (Matthew 2: 1-2)

The Feast of the Epiphany, or revelation of Christ to the Gentiles is observed on January 6. The season of Epiphany is a time for remembering the recognition of Jesus as God by many people, among them the magi, John The Baptist, Jesus' disciples, and Christians in every age, including our own. It is also a time for remembering the signs of Jesus that revealed his presence to the people. The beauty of the manifestation to the whole world is that when we see Christ we are seeing God.

The three wisemen or magi (people who studied the movement of the stars to interpret their meaning) set their sights on a star that lead them on a journey of faith and discovery. They found baby Jesus lying in a manger and they worshiped him. The Epiphany calls us to set our sights on the "star" of God which will lead us to a deeper faith, joy and peace.

"What are the stars that you follow in your life-----what 'signs' do you find yourself paying the most attention to?" Do you need to re-chart your course?

May our paths be illuminated by God as we journey with the Magi to Bethlehem and into a new year filled with hope.

We are in the process of revamping and revising the current St. Mark's website with an expected launch of the new site in January / February 2008.

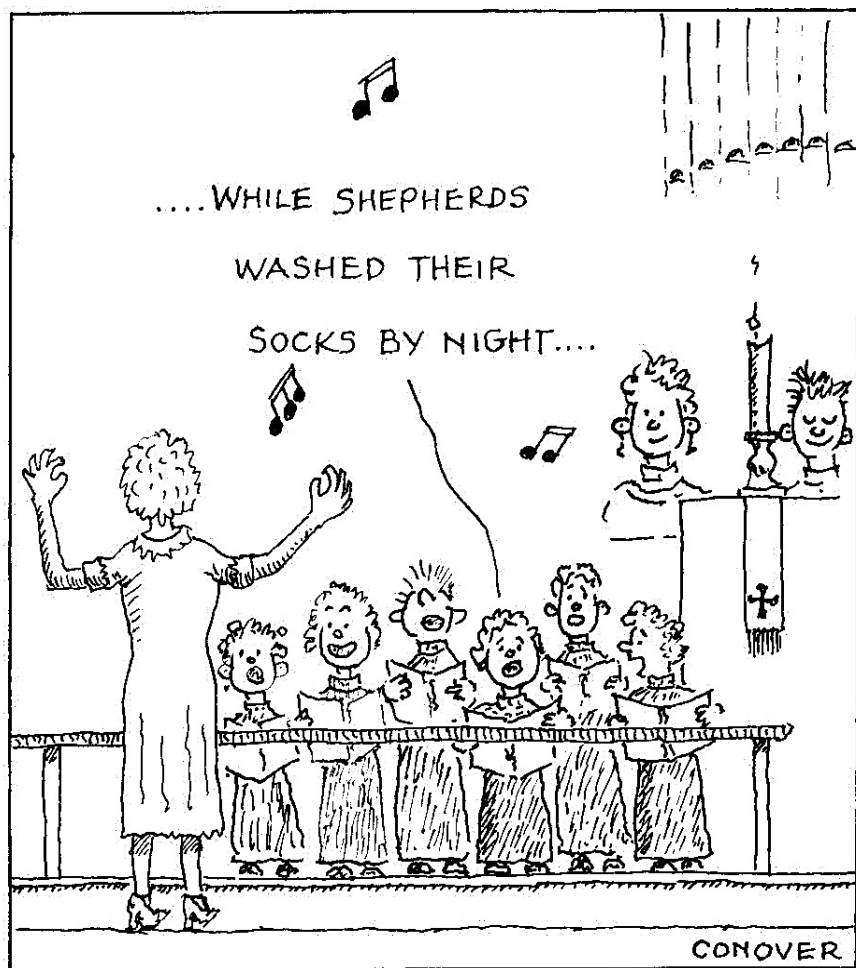

### *Cash Donations To St. Marks*

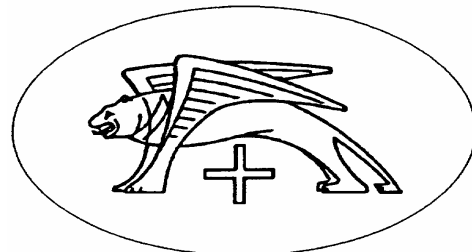

### *Finance Report as of 11-30-07*

A summary of St. Mark's operating statement is included below. We are below Pledge budget by \$33,116. Other donations that include Rummage and September Song were closer to their target. Below budget expenses resulted from less personnel, lower outreach and the \$8,200 quarterly diocese third quarter contribution deferral until December. The diocese is providing strong support to our interim process and rector search planning.

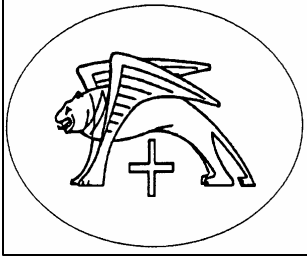

### *Notes from your Profile Commission:*

Thank you to everyone who filled out a parish survey. We received 108 completed adult surveys and 33 children's surveys. Paige Pioppi has created a database, entered the data, and will have an analysis of the data which will be presented for discussion at the upcoming cottage meetings.

Here are a few highlights from Paige's preliminary tabulations:

Nearly everyone has a positive or very positive view of St. Mark's.

Nearly everyone would recommend St. Mark's to a friend.

The music program is important to people and is delivering on the level of importance.

Growing the church is important - welcoming members, new member events.

Fellowship activities are rated very highly - there is a desire to connect to one another at St. Mark's.

One of the qualities desired in a rector (that is in clear agreement as "important") is dedication to high caliber and quality of Christian education for youth.

Over 95% of the people who have completed the survey are pledging members. Most agree that we could do better in stewardship.

The children's surveys reflect a wide sampling of the ages of our youth. They enjoy being with their families at church, being involved in Sunday School, choir and outreach projects, and attending everything under the heading of "social events". Most of the respondents would tell people that we are nice at St. Mark's. The traits most often asked for in our new Rector are: kindness, respectfulness, humor and friendliness.

## Vestry and Convention Delegate Nominations

The Nominating Committee, appointed by the Vestry, has spent the last several weeks creating the slate of candidates which will stand for election at the Annual Meeting in January. As mentioned in last month's Lions Roar, we were hoping to present a slate which included more candidates than positions to be filled. This would have brought us in line with the vast majority of the churches in the Diocese. As with anything new, this was met with some resistance by prospective candidates, and ultimately we were unsuccessful in this endeavor. Nevertheless, the candidates we are presenting are all talented and hard working people, and we thank them for their willingness to serve our congregation in this critical period as we transition from one Rector to another. Herewith the candidates:

Junior Warden: Buck Kirch

Vestry 3-year term: Betsy Coffin, Tom DeFeo, Neil McLaughlan, Teri Passarello

Vestry 1-year term: Paul Chiappetta

Delegates to Convention and Convocation: Bill Schmidt, Marylea Schmidt

Alternate Delegates to Convention and Convocation: Jackie Kahle, Doug Post

(Under the By-Laws, one Warden is automatically a Delegate to Convention. If he cannot attend the other Warden is expected to do so in his place).

Also according to the By-Laws, nominations by petition may be made in writing by any five (5) or more qualified voters not later than Monday following Christmas week in form of petition available in the narthex or on request. The petition shall include designation of the office, the nominee, and the same identifying material as presented in the biographies that follow, and signatures of the nominators and the nominee. The nominee(s) must be qualified voters, and any nominee for Warden must have previously served two (2) years on St. Mark's Vestry. The Nominating Committee shall read nominations by petition at the annual parish meeting following presentation of the slate. Nominations from the floor are not permitted. As Christmas is on a Tuesday this year, the deadline is Monday, December 31, 2007.

**Betsy Coffin:** I have been a member of St. Mark's church for 18 years and a life long Episcopalian. While at St. Mark's, I have taught Sunday School for both my children's classes for about ten years, have co-chaired the rummage sale four times, and have partnered in the production of the creche service four times. I have had the opportunity to work at the food bank, and become involved in various fund raisers throughout our time at St. Marks.

I currently work for the Central NJ Maternal and Child Health Consortium, managing the evaluation teams, and family support programs for six counties in the State's Early Intervention program. I received a BA in Sociology from the University of Delaware and a masters degree in Public Administration from Seton Hall University. My husband Bill and I have two children, Caroline a freshman in college, and Nicholas a junior in High School.

**Tom DeFeo:**

My wife Sharon and I have been members of the church since 1992. We have two children, Spencer age 15 and Morgan age 12. We have lived in the Liberty Corner section of town since 1988. Although I have not served on the Vestry, I have been involved with many of the church functions and activities including the rummage sale, brunches, auction dinners, fall and spring clean up, ushering and most recently the personnel committee. I have managed my own business, Tom DeFeo Pools, a swimming pool and spa service company, since 1990.

**Buck Kirch:** Buck Kirch is a New Jersey native and a long time resident of Basking Ridge. Upon completion of military service, Buck and his wife Ellen, a former Plainfield first grade teacher, moved to Goltra Drive in 1969. Buck's career was primarily spent in sales and marketing positions with retailers, distributors, and manufacturers in the furniture industry.

As an antidote for retirement, he currently works for AAA; and has become expert at telling travelers, and others, exactly where to go and how to get there. Buck and Ellen have two grown children. Ned, his wife Susan, and son Trevor reside in Albuquerque while Steven lives in Greensboro, North Carolina. His community service has included membership in Kiwanis and stints as Cub-master, as Boy Scout committee chairman, and as a really lame soccer coach.

Buck has been a member of Saint Mark's since 1975. He has served on the Vestry, as Warden, as an Usher and for over nineteen years, as Treasurer. And, still, no one knows his real first name.

**Neil McLaughlan:**

Born and raised in New Jersey, I graduated from Yale and received an M.B.A. From Harvard. My business career was in retail as a national merchandise manager for JC Penney and as a vice president for sales and marketing in a large hosiery company.


I have participated in many St. Mark's events (usually cleaning up) and of course the Rummage Sale. For the past two years I have been playing the piano at the 8am Service.
